

Feb 2017 Burr ridge Heath, Folly Farm, Brail

Bedwyn Footpath Group monthly walk – Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> Feb, from the village hall

A 3.25 mile circular walk to Burr ridge Heath, Folly Farm & Bedwyn Brail.

!2 walkers set off along the pretty ancient track, Galley Lane, then up the hill to Burr ridge Heath, past the historic remains of a brick kiln. Then we made our way downhill to Folly Farm through a lovely open valley between Birch Copse and Round Copse. After crossing the Shalbourne road we headed up into Bedwyn Brail and made our way back down to the village from there.

This month's walk passed along a couple of fenced field-edge footpaths recently given over and undergrowth trims by our working parties and another grass path which our group are also cutting regularly now so it is thanks to their efforts that this route is easily accessible.

There are no stiles on the route but often plenty of mud in wet weather.

*Deer are frequently seen grazing by Round Copse and in Bedwyn Brail so dog-owners please keep dogs on leads through these areas so that walkers can enjoy seeing the deer.*
